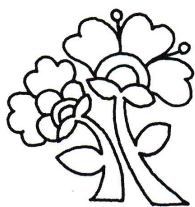

Seder Plate

Decorate a paper plate with Pesach symbols. Glue foil muffin cups to the plate and fill with individual portions of parsley, charoset, egg, maror, and bone. Give one to every guest.

CHAROSET

2 cups chopped apples
 1/2 cup chopped nuts
 1/2 teaspoon cinnamon
 2 Tbsp. sweet wine
 Mix together and chill.

Pillow Cover

Draw or paint Pesach symbols on a special pillow case to cover the Seder pillow.



Cup for Elijah

Cover two paper cups (a size apart) with foil, and glue the bottoms together.

MATZAH MEAL LATKES

Mix together:

1/4 cup matzah meal 4 eggs
 1/2 teaspoon salt 1/2 cup water

Drop by tablespoons into well-oiled frying pan. Serve with cinnamon and sugar or jelly.

THE TEN PLAGUES

For a dramatic seder, bring the 10 plagues to life!

Blood: Red food coloring in cup of water

Frogs: Stickers from party shop

Lice: White rice (add eyes with a marker)

Beasts: Animal masks

Cattle disease: Green spots on plastic cows

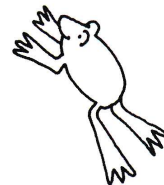
Boils: Red puffy paint on band-aids

Hail: Styrofoam packing pellets

Locusts: Plastic grasshoppers

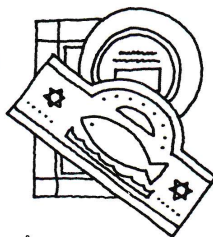
Darkness: Blindfolds

Death of firstborn: Black armbands



Place Mats

Collect labels from matzah, wine, gefilte fish, and other Passover foods. Arrange them on a large piece of cardboard. Cover both sides with clear self-adhesive shelf paper.



Place Cards

Fold index cards in half and decorate with holiday symbols or spring flowers. Write each guest's name on a card.



Matzah Cover

Sew four pieces of cloth together, leaving one side open to insert three pieces of matzah. Decorate the top cloth with crayon pictures of holiday symbols. Cover with waxed paper, and iron to set the design. Make a matching afikomen bag.



NUT AND RAISIN COOKIES

3 eggs 1/2 cup raisins
 1/2 cup sugar 1/2 tsp. salt
 1/2 cup cake meal 1/2 tsp. cinnamon
 1/2 cup chopped nuts

Beat eggs well and add rest of ingredients. Let the batter set for 15 minutes. Drop by spoonfuls onto oiled cookie sheet, leaving room for cookies for spread. Bake 15 minutes at 400°.
